Stitchin' Sisters is a quilting pattern company owned by Rosemary Wissink of Fall Creek, Wisconsin. Rosemary has traveled to Kenya three times in the past 5 years to work with the women at Amani Ya Juu, a sewing, marketing and training project serving refugees and other women in need. The 2007 travel team includes Rosemary, Shelly Stokes (Cedar Canyon Textiles), June Vogltance (Vogies Quilts & Treasures) and long-arm quilter Bonnie Bosma (Quilting Magic). The team will travel to Nairobi in November.

There are many expenses associated with these mission trips. Travel costs are obvious, but there are also many "invisible" costs, such as paying the wages of the women we are training – as we are taking them away from their production work during our visit. We also use any funds raised to take appropriate supplies, such as thread, sewing machine needles, high quality scissors, and so forth.
